Board of Directors Meeting January 16, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President Gary Pohl at 3:02 pm via Zoom

## Agenda

Sharon moved to approve, Mindy seconded and the agenda was approved as presented.

## **Minutes of Previous Meeting**

The minutes of the November were presented with the secretary unable to have corrected a section regarding planters that were not paid for. By Durham Transport. There was no one present from GEB who could help with the correction, so ST moved and Mina seconded to approve the remainder of the minutes with an understanding that the secretary would make the correction asap.

## **President's Report**

Gary reported that the snow and ice accumulated by the previous storms still needed to be removed from the driveway and door accesses. We are waiting for Scott Allen who has just recently returned from a trip Outside.

The snowload on the roof is questionable. Gary suggested adding a post to the center of the ridgepole inside the cabin. This could be in the form of an adjustable post jack for \$150 or by a pole cut to fit.

The path to the outhouse needs to be shoveled, and later access made to the white house. Mindy, Gary, and Mina will meet with Ventilation Solutions to investigate costs and methods to provide heat recovery ventilation to the building.

The Omicron virus is still keeping access to the library limited.

#### **Financial Report**

The report in the board packet was for (Oct 1 to Jan 14)

Updated to today: Income was \$279.36, Checking account \$806.53, Savings \$25,249.96, Passive House Savings \$14,523.42. The credit card has charges of \$1,101.78.

The Commercial Revenue Sharing grant funds are due any day and will be \$5263.

Mina noted that a \$20 cash donation was made, and she left it in the office.

# **Collections**

7097 books are in the catalog with 5882 of them shelved in Clausen, 1213 are sorted, boxed, and returned to storage in the white house.

The cataloging of the Four Winds collection is complete.

- Kay Sisson, Mindy, and Karyn Holder are the catalogers. They will keep on working and next time begin to examine photos stored in the white house.
- Due to the amount of snow, some members of the catalog crew cannot access the Clausen Cabin, nor have they been able to access books stored in the white house.
- The Guinn collection sorting is finished other than those boxes stored in the trailer. This collection contained mostly cooking, travel, speech and language therapy, history, and fiction. The speech and language books and most of the cookbooks will be relocated to more appropriate places.

James Rogan donated twenty one books of interest.
